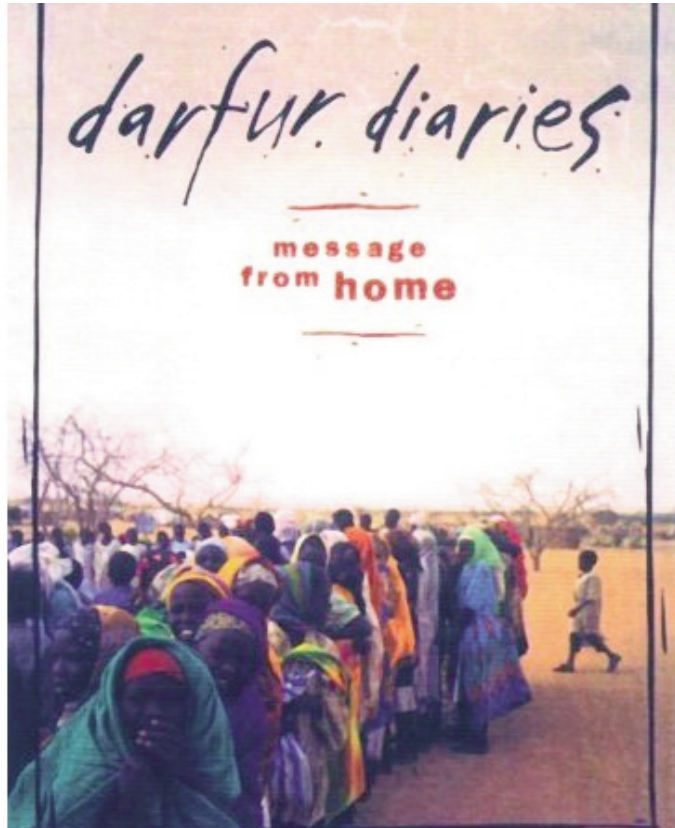

Human Tragedy and the World's Response



A film screening of “Darfur Diaries” will be followed by a discussion featuring Hamza Ibrahim and Selena Brewer

Hamza Ibrahim was a trader in Darfur until he fled the country for the United States twelve years ago. He now works as a taxi driver and is an active member of the Darfur People's Association and the New York Coalition to Save Darfur. He will talk about the situation in Darfur and will discuss the efforts to bring international pressure to stop genocide in the region.

Selena Brewer worked in commercial law for a number of years before moving into humanitarian work in 2004. She spent a year in Sudan with Oxfam GB, working in two small villages in far West Darfur. She then moved on to work in Chad and Central African Republic as a Humanitarian Affairs Officer for Medecins Sans Frontieres (Doctors without Borders), investigating human rights abuses and documenting the humanitarian crises. In the summer of 2007 she began work for Human Rights Watch as Darfur Researcher/Advocate, based in New York. Brewer has a Masters in Human Rights from the London School of Economics.
