Participants receive academic and financial support throughout the certification and hiring process, as well as access to a dedicated counselor who will help with advisement and academic supports.

You may be eligible if you:

- Are a currently enrolled CUNY student who is accepted into, or intends to apply to, a CUNY Teacher Education program
- Have a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA
- Have experience working/volunteering in urban communities
- Have already completed 24 credits toward an associate degree or 45 credits toward a bachelor's degree, or are currently enrolled in a CUNY graduate teacher education program

Enrolled CUNY students who do not meet the full criteria may be accepted as a "pipeline" student with at least a 2.75 cumulative GPA.
