FROM THE FAQ

- a) Question: I graduated in December 2019 or earlier but I have not passed the edTPA and/or other tests . What are my options?

Answer: You qualify for the COVID-19 Emergency Certificate. If you already graduated from Brooklyn College prior to June 2020, you are not eligible for the edTPA Safety Net.

TRANSITIONAL B, TRANSITIONAL C, AND INTERNSHIP CERTIFICATE INFORMATION

Candidates enrolled in Transitional B and C programs must hold a valid Transitional B and C certificate, respectively, while employed in their school district placement. The Internship certificate enables eligible candidates to gain paid experience during their internship in their New York State registered graduate educator preparation program leading to teacher, school counselor, or educational leadership certification. Please note that this certificate is not available for school psychology candidates.

The Transitional B, Transitional C, and Internship certificate webpages have been updated to provide detailed information about these certificates for candidates and institutions of higher education (IHEs). The information includes a description of the certificate, the validity period, if time extensions are available, and the directions for IHEs when candidates leave or complete the program.

For example, if a candidate who holds one of these certificates leaves the educator preparation program prior to graduating, his/her certificate is no longer valid. When this happens, IHEs should immediately send an email to the Office of Teaching Initiatives stating that the candidate is no longer enrolled in the program and the TEACH system needs to be updated to reflect the date on which the candidate left the program, becoming the certificate's new expiration date.

When candidates complete the educator preparation program, these certificates are no longer valid and the IHE must enter the College Recommendations for certification into TEACH. Programs that lead to Provisional/Permanent or Initial/Professional certification should enter both types into the system. In addition, programs should not withhold or delay the posting of the candidates' College Recommendation until they complete certification exams, unless the exams are also program requirements (e.g., School District Leader and School District Business Leader programs).

The information in this letter is based on current resources from the NY State Dept. of Education Office of Teaching Initiatives (OTI) and Pearson to the best of our present knowledge. Certification and testing rules are subject to change. NY State certification is subject to confirmation based on the date of an evaluation by OTI.
