

RETENTION AND GRADUATION RATES

Explanation: These tables present the retention and graduation outcomes for students who entered as part of a particular entering cohort. "Cohort" is the fall semester in which students in that cohort were admitted to Brooklyn College. "Initial Count" is the number of students in that cohort. "One-Year Retention" is the percentage of students who returned for the following fall semester; so for the Fall 2010 cohort, it would be the proportion of students who returned for fall 2011. The "Four-Year Cumulative Graduation Rate" is the percentage of the students in the initial count for that cohort who had graduated within four years of first enrolling. For the fall 2010 cohort, that would include all students who completed their degree before fall 2014. The "Six-Year Cumulative Graduation Rate" is the percentage of the students in the initial count for that cohort who had graduated within six years of first enrolling. For the fall 2010 cohort, that would include all students who completed their degree before fall 2016.

<u>Explanation:</u> Mean time from first semester to final semester where degree is conferred, fall semesters. Completion of a degree following a fall semester counts as half a year; completing a degree in either the spring or summer semester counts as a full year.


