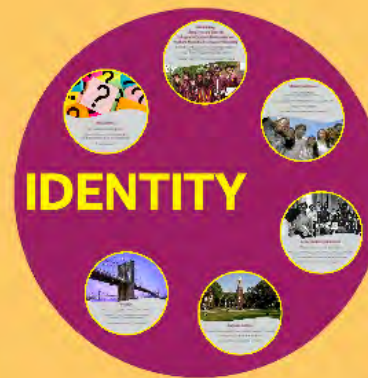




Listening Tour Methodology

- Both solicited and volunteered input
- 50+ meetings with about 150 faculty, 130 students, 170 staff, 100 alums, 40 donors, 7 electeds, 20 community leaders
- 4 forums with 200+ people attending
- 300+ survey responses
- Dozens personal emails and letters
- Not statistically significant, but remarkably consistent responses across stakeholders

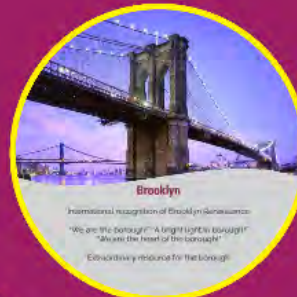

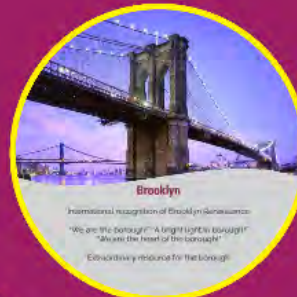

Budget

Not enough resources for anything
Monetizing everything (FTEs = gold)
"Corporatization of the academy"
Hidden pots of money???

"Support" received from BC and CC
"I graduated in 1971!"



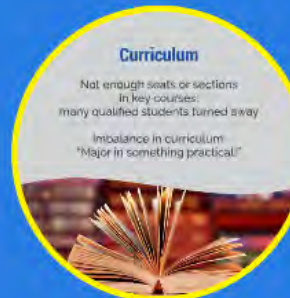
Infrastructure

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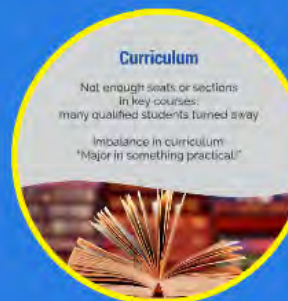
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EVOLUTION

Enhance Quality

- Hire more excellent faculty, esp. diverse faculty

- Make governance more collaborative



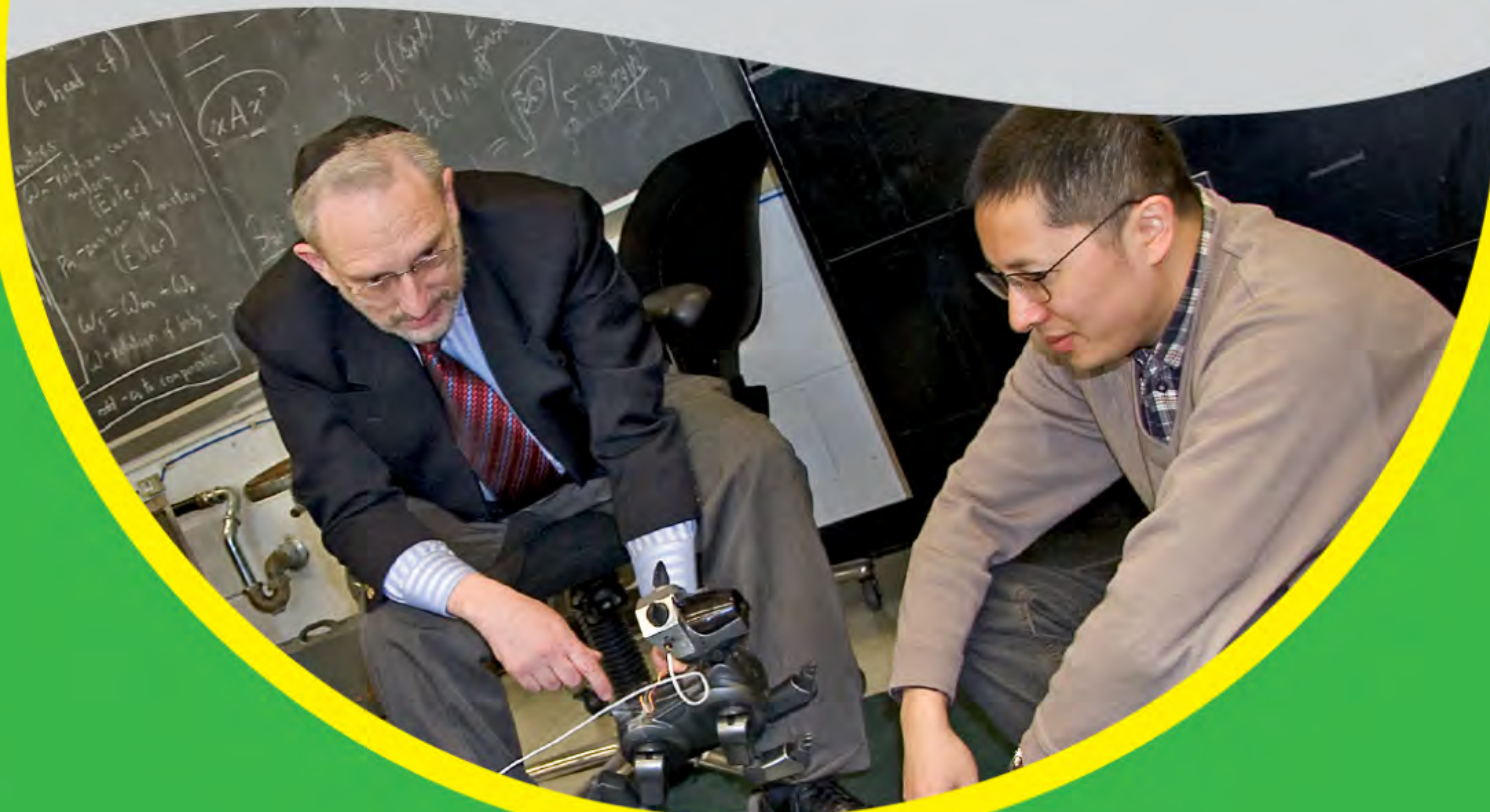
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
