The course will also involve projects students will be expected to complete in and around New York on various topics.

Jeremy R. Porter, Assistant Professor in Children's Studies and Department of Finance, Business, and Management has recently published his new book in 2010: *Tracking the Mobility of Crime: New Geographies and Methodologies in Modeling the Diffusion of Offending.* Published by Cambridge Scholars Publishing: United Kingdom.

The book is based upon an earlier work in 2008, which received a Postdoc/Graduate Student Paper of the Year Award presented by the American Statistical Association. Professor Porter also

has numerous publications and activities that are listed under his <u>Brooklyn College</u> <u>faculty profile</u>.

Children and the Law-

For anyone who plans to work with children and youth, are raising their own children, or has been a child themselves!



The *Children and the Law* course will be offered in Spring 2011 on Tuesday/Thursday from 3:40PM to 4:55PM. The course analyses the laws that affect children and youth, and how activism and social movements can help to change laws and attitudes.

This course opens up new potential career paths in child and youth related areas of child advocacy, social services, education, health and mental health, as well as the juvenile justice system.

Children and the Law covers topics such as the juvenile justice

system, sexual exploitation, issues of abuse and neglect, foster care, emancipation, and delinquency.

These compelling topics are taught through discussions, guest lecturers, readings, films, and more. The course uses guest speakers as a mean to connect and teach students various topics and about careers involving children and the law. Former guest speakers include executives and representatives from organizations such as GEMS, Empire State Coalition, Community Mediation Services, and more.

Children and the Law will provide students with a comprehensive understanding of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child and a general knowledge of aspects of law, ranging from family and social services to juvenile and criminal, as they apply to children and youth. This course is designed to introduce students to the role law plays in many facets of the lives of children, ranging from education to child welfare to juvenile justice.

This course fulfills the requirements toward the Children's Studies Major, Concentration, and Minor.

Children's Studies Career Exploration Internship

The Children's Studies Program offers the CHST 4100 (95): *Internship in Applied Children's Studies* each semester. Students must have completed CHST 2100 (20), 3110 (30), or 3610 (31) or have permission from the program director to take the internship course. This course fulfills the requirements toward the Children's Studies Major, Concentration and Minor or as an elective for all other students.
