### **NYC Department of Health and Mental Hygiene- Brooklyn District Public Health Office- Internships**

The Brooklyn District Public Health Offices are hiring for two internship positions this semester:

One internship involves working with DPHO staff to recruit local businesses to participate in a Healthy Fundraiser scratch card for local schools. The intern will create scratch card starter kits for schools to easily implement this healthy fundraiser at their schools in the 2011-12 school year. Interns will be based at the Brooklyn DPHO in Bedford Stuyvesant from June 2011 to September 2011. Among other tasks the intern will provide a write up on progress, data entry, and update database of recruited businesses.

Another internship possibility is working on a research project called Cardiovascular Health of Seniors and the Built Environment. This study aims to measure how access to healthy foods and physical activity opportunities influence what people eat, their exercise and health. Interns will be in the field conducting assessments of the built environment 2-4 days a week. Interns will also be involved with data coding, data entry, and phone interviews. The intern will be required to travel to the Brooklyn and Queens locations.
