POLAND- "Children Studies as an Interpretative Perspective" (March 2012):

Professor Gertrud Lenzer was invited as keynote presenter at the first conference on Children Studies in Poland at the University of Bialystok. The conference, "Children Studies as an Interpretative Perspective," referred to Brooklyn College in its "Call for Papers" as the founder of Children's Studies in 1991. Professor Lenzer was the only foreign speaker and representative of Children's Studies Programs from any country. Her presentation, "Children's Studies and the Human Rights of Children: Future Challenges," has been translated into Polish and will be published in the conference proceedings.

NORTH CAROLINA- "Human Rights and the Humanities" (March 2012):

Professor Gertrud Lenzer was also invited as one of the moderators at the international conference "Human Rights and the Humanities," convened at the National Humanities Center in the Research Triangle Park, North Carolina. The panel--Professor Lenzer, Evelyn Brooks Higginbotham, Harvard University, and Samuel Moyn, Columbia University--discussed the topic "How can the history of humanitarianism or other rights movements illuminate our understanding of human rights? How pertinent to the practical application of human rights law today is an understanding of prior movements?"
