FOR APPLICANTS TO THE LATIN/GREEK INSTITUTE

PROOF OF RESIDENCE FOR STUDENTS CLAIMING NEW YORK STATE RESIDENCY

Proof of continuous residency in New York State dating back to June 10, 2012 or before must be provided. Please send as many proofs as possible. Copies of the following items should be submitted:

- Lease, deed, or rent registration form (used for rent stabilized apartments)
- Signed 2012 New York State and Federal income tax forms, complete with figures

In addition, at least two of the following:

- homeowner's or renter's insurance policy
- telephone or utility bills covering a period of up to 12 months
- automobile registration issued in this period
- automobile insurance certificate
- checking account monthly statements covering a period of up to 12 months or savings bank books indicating your name and address

If you are dependent upon a parent or legal guardian, the State and Federal income tax forms of this person must be sent to show that you are claimed as a dependent. If you are independent of your parents, the documents listed above should be for you. (Please note that if your parents pay for your tuition during the year, you are not considered independent of your parents.)

Please note that if acceptable documentation is not offered, the student will have to pay the tuition for a non-New York State resident.

Vaccinations

Please be aware that New York State Law states that all students attending college in New York State must be vaccinated or prove immunity to mumps, measles, and Rubella (German measles). Proof of immunization (two measles, one mumps and one rubella vaccinations) must be submitted along with the application. No one may attend the Institute without such proofs.
