- 2) Once you have received notification that you have been accepted at the Latin/Greek Institute, you must register with and pay tuition to Brooklyn College, using the CUNYfirst online system. Instructions will be provided. *Proof of tuition paid in full must be presented to the LGI by the first day of class.*
