

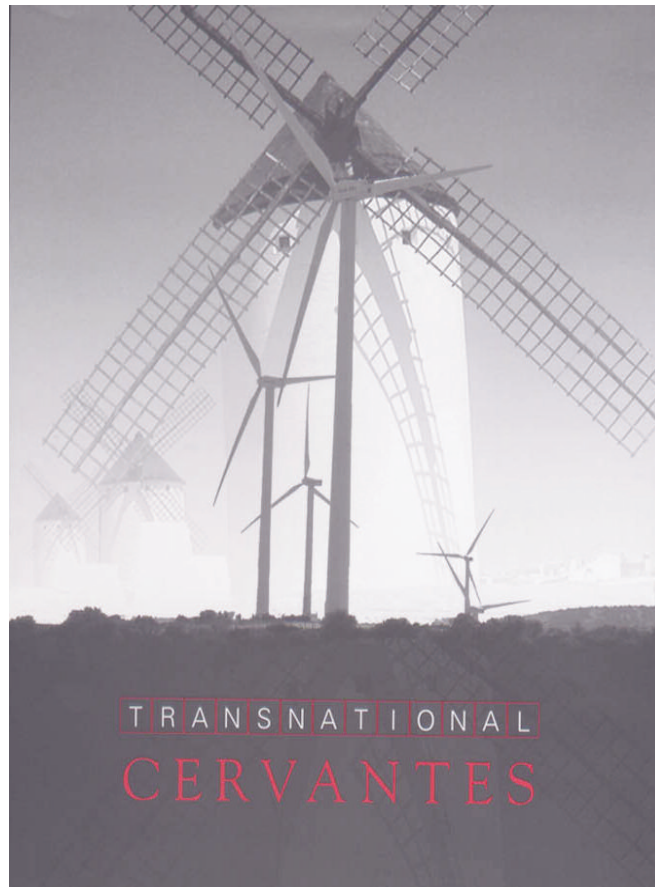

## *Transnational Cervantes*



**William Childers** received his Ph.D. in Spanish from Columbia University in 1997. He has published over a dozen scholarly articles on the Spanish Baroque, mainly Cervantes. His first book, *Transnational Cervantes* (University of Toronto Press, 2006) won the MLA's Katherine Singer Kovacs Prize, awarded annually to one book in Spanish or Latin American literature and culture. His work brings together literary texts and archival documents, and attempts to bring the resulting configuration to bear on contemporary issues. Currently he is working on a book on the Morisco question, provisionally titled *Spain's Last Moors*.
