## Alternative Sources of Energy Policy

*How the Candidates Reached their Positions*



**Dr. Tammy L. Lewis** holds the Carol L. Zicklin Chair in the Honors Academy at Brooklyn College and a faculty line in the Sociology and Anthropology Department at Muhlenberg College in Allentown, Pennsylvania. Tammy Lewis' research examines the effects of globalization on environmentalism and sustainability. She also studies transnational social movements, with a focus on Latin America. She was recently a Fulbright scholar in Ecuador collecting data for a project that looks at the impacts of transnational funding on the organization of the Ecuadorian environmental movement and on Ecuador's urban and rural environments. She is co-author of *Twenty Lessons in Environmental Sociology* (2009) with Kenneth A. Gould, and *Environment, Energy, and Society* (2002) with Craig R. Humphrey and Frederick H. Buttel. She has also published work on the difficulties of long-term coalitions between labor unions and environmentalists.
