Austria, the EU, the US and Beyond



Dr. Christian Prosl has been Ambassador of Austria to the United States in Washington, DC since May 2009. From 2003 to 2006 he served as Austrian Ambassador to Germany. Prosl studied Law and French at the University of Vienna and pursued International Studies in Geneva. He has been accredited as translator for French. From 1973 to 1977 he was working at the United Nations Development Program (UNDP) in Burkina Faso and Rwanda. After joining the Foreign Service in 1977, he was assigned to the Austrian Embassy in London, and from 1981-1988 Dr. Prosl held several positions at the Austrian Embassy in Washington, DC. From 1991 to 1995 he served as Austrian Consul General in Los Angeles. His political career also includes serving as Deputy Secretary General for Foreign Affairs, Director of the Department on Western and Northern Europe, and Director General of the Section on Legal and Consular Affairs at the Austrian Ministry for Foreign Affairs.
