He has been a staff writer for *Egypt Today* and *Business Today Egypt*, and has worked as a journalist with the *Cairo Times*. He has also freelanced for the *World Press Review*, *Forbes' Billionaires*, CNN, BBC Radio, Reuters, and Platts.

Louis Fishman is an assistant professor in the history department and specializes in questions dealing with Palestinian and Israeli history in the late Ottoman period, Palestinian-Israeli conflict, modern Turkey and late Ottoman history. He has written the chapter "The Emergence of a 'Jewish' Question in Istanbul 1908-1914: Zionism, Antisemitism, and the 1911 Ottoman Parliament Debate on Zionism" in *Late Ottoman Palestine: The Period of Young Turk Rule* (I.B. Tauris, 2011). His interests include construction of nationalism, state-building and historical narratives.
