**John L. Jackson, Jr.** is Richard Perry University Professor and Dean of the School of Social Policy & Practice at the University of Pennsylvania. A cultural anthropologist by training, he holds professorships in the Departments of Anthropology, Africana Studies, and the Annenberg School for Communication. He is the author of *Harlemworld: Doing Race and Class in Contemporary Black America* (University of Chicago, 2003); *Real Black: Adventures in Racial Sincerity* (University of Chicago, 2005); *Racial Paranoia: The Unintended Consequences of Political Correctness* (Basic Civitas Books, 2008); *Thin Description: Ethnography and the African Hebrew Israelites of Jerusalem* (Harvard University Press, 2013); and *Impolite Conversations: On Race, Politics, Sex, Money, and Religion* (Atria Books, 2014) co-authored with Cora Daniels; and *Televised Redemption: Black Religious Media and Racial Empowerment* (New York University Press, 2016).
