

Join us for a presentation on Harlem calypso and Brooklyn soca (soul/calypso) music drawn from Ray Allen's recently released book *Jump Up! Professor Allen will trace the migration and transformation of Trinidadian calypso music in Harlem and Brooklyn through a diasporic transational lens.
