- The Certification is multidisciplinary and open to professionals specializing in children from birth to five (e.g., OT, PT, Social Workers, Speech Language Pathologists, EC Special Educators, Nutritionists, Nurses)
- The NYC Dept. of Health and Mental Hygiene supports the Advanced Certificate (AC)
- > For certified educators, AC may be applied to Master's Degree in Early Childhood, and extension in EC Special Education

PROGRAM DETAILS

- > Emphasizes competencies endorsed by New York State Association for Infant Mental Health
- Clinically rich fieldwork with families and infants in various settings (e.g., families' homes, Early Head Start, Early Intervention/Childcare settings, and/or hospital and medical settings)
- > 280 fieldwork hours embedded throughout the coursework, performed in consultation with instructors
- Students may have their current employment in infant/toddler settings considered for fieldwork
