Feminist philosophers bring new insights into many areas of philosophy, and they offer an insightful critique of traditional western philosophy, which often neglects the woman's perspective. They also introduce new issues that are of special concern to women, which have been previously overlooked.

This course will focus on the practical and theoretical concerns of feminists through a topic-based approach. We shall consider issues such as the influence of gender in the family, sexual harassment, pornography, abortion, the norms of feminine appearance, and whether our language needs to be reformed from a variety of feminist perspectives. This course is designed to give students who may not have a background in feminist thought a sampling of the philosophical contributions they have made.
