



The Feirstein Graduate School of Cinema, which opened in fall 2015, is housed on a working film lot — Steiner Studios at the Brooklyn Navy Yard. It is also the first public graduate film school in New York. The school is dedicated to cultivating new and emerging voices in cinema in a diverse and inclusive learning environment, and offers two degree programs: the master of arts (M.A.) in cinema studies and the master of fine arts (M.F.A.) in cinema arts.

M.F.A. IN CINEMA ARTS

A three-year full-time 66-credit program that offers a highly specialized education and industry internships in a collaborative, hands-on learning environment. Students are admitted to one of five filmmaking specializations:

- Cinematography**
- Directing**
- Post-production**
- Producing**
- Screenwriting**

M.A. IN CINEMA STUDIES

A two-year full- or part-time, 36-credit program that provides you with a comprehensive education in cinema history, theory, criticism and aesthetics, and encourages the scholarly exploration of cinema as a form of art and a means of social communication. You will also be prepared to engage with the rapidly changing media landscape through an understanding of its broadest aesthetic and cultural implications.

Because the degree program will be housed in the same facility as the M.F.A. in Cinema Arts — Steiner Studios — you will be able to deepen your knowledge within the context of a larger community of filmmakers and cinema scholars. The program's interrelationship with the M.F.A. and its connection to the film and media industries makes it truly unique.

ADMISSION

The fall application deadline for both the M.A and M.F.A is January 15, 2016, for priority consideration.
