Articulation Agreement

A. SENDING AND RECEIVING INSTITUTIONS

Sending College: New York City College of Technology (City Tech)
Department/School: School of Arts and Sciences
Program: LIBERAL ARTS
Degree: Associate in Arts (AA)

Receiving College: Brooklyn College (BC)
Department: Psychology Department
Program: PSYCHOLOGY
Degree: Bachelor of Arts (BA)

B. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR BROOKLYN COLLEGE PROGRAM

A student must have a 2.5 average or better (or departmental approval otherwise) and have completed all requirements for the AA in Liberal Arts (LAA) at New York City College of Technology (City Tech).

Students who wish to transfer but do not meet all of the above requirements or are unable to enroll within two years after graduation will receive admission consideration under Brooklyn College's standard transfer credit policies.

Total transfer credit granted toward baccalaureate degree: 60

Total additional credits required by senior college to complete baccalaureate degree: 60

In order to satisfy the BA degree requirements, students must select the appropriate general education common core and flexible core courses to satisfy CUNY pathway requirements for the degree program.

BC and City Tech agree to offer the courses noted in the BA program in Psychology (BC) and AA in Liberal Arts program (City Tech), as described in this agreement, and as outlined in each college's course catalog. Each college agrees to notify the other if course numbers, content, or catalog descriptions change. Furthermore, the parties involved understand that any change in course number, content, or catalog description may require a modification to this agreement.

C. COURSE EQUIVALENCIES AND TRANSFER CREDIT AWARDED

Students transferring from City Tech with an AA in Liberal Arts shall enter the BA Program in Psychology at Brooklyn College as juniors. The following courses, totaling 60 credits, will be transferred to Brooklyn College.


2. Procedures for evaluating the effectiveness of this agreement and tracking the number of students who transfer from City Tech to BC under terms of this articulation agreement and their success:

Each year, Brooklyn College will provide New York City College of Technology the following information: a) the number of City Tech graduates who applied to the program; b) the number of City Tech students who were accepted into the program; c) and the number of City Tech students who enrolled; d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students at Brooklyn College.


3. Sending and Receiving College procedures for publicizing agreement (e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisors, websites, etc.):

- This articulation agreement will be publicized on the New York City College of Technology's website and Brooklyn College's website.
- Transfer advisors at City Tech will promote this agreement with eligible students.
