## Civic Engagement



The goal of the Office of Civic Engagement is to promote student life, student learning, and academic and personal success. We hold workshops, conferences, and many other programs designed to provide students with a meaningful and enjoyable co-curricular and academic experience during college. The Office of Civic Engagement also runs the C.L.A.S.E. Passport Program. The Civic Learning and Student Engagement Program (C.L.A.S.E.) is designed to engage students in co-curricular activities on campus beneficial to their educational and personal development. ### **Judicial Affairs**

We also provide educational and informational programs to promote a civil campus environment.

Students, faculty and staff are encouraged to submit a Student Behavior Form (SBF) if:

- A student's behavior is disrupting the
- classroom and you would like to discuss the situation.
- A student is having difficulties and you feel s/he could benefit from additional support.



To discuss a concern about a student, please schedule an appointment with the Manager of Judicial Affairs, Moraima Cunningham, located in room 2113 Boylan Hall, 718-951-5352. ## Personal Counseling

A staff of psychologists, counselors and social workers are available to assist you with personal issues or problems you may experience during your college years. Emergency consultations and referrals to outside services are also provided. Workshops are also offered on "Stress Management", "Time Management," "Test Anxiety," "Procrastination", and more.

All services are free and confidential. No information is released without the student's consent. Appointments for

services may be made in person, or by phone.

## **BROOKLYN COLLEGE ATHLETICS**

A good education, health, and interaction with others are vital components to personal well-being and a fulfilling life. To help Brooklyn College students achieve these aims, the Department of Recreation, Intramurals and Intercollegiate Athletics (funded mostly by student activity fees), organizes, administers and promotes a diversified program of activities and services – from individual workouts to a broad array of team sports.

The Brooklyn College Bulldogs compete at the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division III level and are members of the City University of New York Athletic Conference (CUNYAC). The College fields 12 varsity athletic teams, six each for women and men, as well as a co-ed cheerleading squad. All students, whatever their level of athletic experience, have the opportunity to be part of a team.

The recreation program at Brooklyn College provides a wide range of noncompetitive experiences to individuals as well. Members of the college community may use the excellent facilities to work out for relaxation and physical fitness during their leisure time. There are also intramural events, including team sports, individual and dual sports, and one-day special events.

Our challenge is to create, promote, and organize programs that raise awareness of women's issues, and in return, empower participants to live a fuller life. One that will reduce victimization, encourage self-sufficiency/independence, and learn the skills to

help women organize and sustain an environment where they are better able to maintain a healthy lifestyle, and make choices that will positively impact their own futures.

The Center houses the "Returning Women's Cafe", a multi-function drop-in lounge, the Alice Miller computer lounge, and a resource center. Coffee and tea are available during regular office hours.

## Veterans Affairs

The mission of the Brooklyn College Veteran Affairs and Counseling Center is to assist America's veterans, their family members, and survivors in obtaining all federal and state educational benefits and entitlements they have earned by serving in the United States military, while also providing guidance and support services to aid veterans in their transition to academic and civilian life.

Services include: assisting veterans in applying for the G.I. Bill, certifications and validations of educational benefits in compliance with current state and veteran's administration regulations. Veterans Affairs also aids with updating information regarding changes in education benefits, and assists with academic course planning, discharge upgrades, military transcript, referrals and college services.

## V.A. Highlights from the Fall 2010 Semester:

The Veterans Day Program Committee celebrates Veterans Day with a luncheon, where veterans, members of the college community and students are

recognized for their support and services to the veterans at Brooklyn College. The highlight of the luncheon are the invited leaders from the military and veteran community who help educate the campus community regarding military heritage and culture.

During the spring, the highlighted event is the Memorial Day Weekend program in Washington, DC. which is open not only to all veterans and students but their families and friends.

The Veteran Students' Organization in collaboration with CUNY, participates in both the Veterans Day Parade in New York City and the Memorial Day Parade in Washington, D.C.

Other activities include Veterans Focus Group, and Informational Sessions to better determine the needs of the students served and adapt to meet these needs.

## The B.C. Student Center



The Student Center is home to Student Activities Central, various organizations including the day, night, and graduate Student Governments and the Inter-Greek Council. It also contains study and lounge spaces, a TV room, and a Campus Information Desk where you can check-in your personal belongings, inquire about campus services and events, and contact Brooklyn College departments. A game room/cafe, 'The Spot', is located on the 1st floor where you can grab a snack, a cup of coffee and play "Guitar Hero" or game of pool. All proceeds generated by Student Center Cafe are invested back into the Student Center to make it an even more exciting place to be!

The Brooklyn College Conference Center, comprised of the top two floors of the Student Center, is a meeting Complex open to students, faculty, staff, and residents of the local community. It offers flexible meeting spaces that can accommodate large assemblies, conventions, movie screenings, and award ceremonies.

### EMS/Emergency Medical Services

The Brooklyn College Emergency Medical Squad (BC-EMS) is a student based volunteer service, located in 021 Ingersoll Hall Extension, providing emergency pre-hospital medical care, ambulance services, limited medical screenings, and medical stand-by services for on and off campus events. #### The Information Booth

The Information Booth offers assistance to students and campus visitors. Located on the first floor of Boylan Hall and in operation since 1996, it operates seven days a week during the Fall and Spring semesters, with a reduced schedule during the Summer sessions. Staffed by trained student assistants, the Information Booth provides information on campus services, maps of the campus, and directions to campus offices. With a goal of providing accurate answers to inquiries from students and others, the staff reflects Brooklyn College's multicultural and multilingual nature. #### **B.C. Health Clinic**

The Brooklyn College Health Clinic offers students a wide array of affordable, confidential, and accessible primary care services. These include the diagnosis and treatment of a variety of acute and chronic illnesses. Health education and prevention opportunities are emphasized, along with early screening for detection of disease.

Care is delivered in a patient-centered manner, with respect for the individual's lifestyle, values, and cultural traditions. Students are encouraged to be partners in their own health care decision-making. There is no fee for seeing a practitioner. Laboratory tests, when indicated, are billed to the patient's health insurance, or directly to the individual at reduced rates. ## Student Life & Housing
