With a world-class faculty and highly respected academic programs, Brooklyn College of the City University of New York is an ideal place for students interested in an education of superior quality. Under the leadership of President Karen L. Gould, the college has been energized by the formation of five schools: Business; Education; Humanities and Social Sciences; Natural and Behavioral Sciences; and Visual, Media and Performing Arts. The schools function as centers of excellence that enhance students' learning in their fields of study and attract top entrepreneurs, artists and scientists to our faculty. We also offer honors programs, research and study abroad opportunities, and other forms of engaged learning that allow students to gain experience outside the classroom.

> The Office of International Student Services assists our international students by ensuring they receive the necessary support to succeed academically and socially. Our staff acts as advocates, offering guidance with visa and immigration processes and compliance, and referrals to resources on and off campus.



Last year, Brooklyn College faculty received more than \$10 million in external funding to pursue their research and artistic endeavors from such organizations as:

- the National Endowment for the Arts. for theater, art, literary and music projects;
- the National Science Foundation, for environmental and alternative energy research;
- the National Institutes of Health, for drug and disease research, including tuberculosis, Parkinson's and HIV/AIDS; and
- the Leakey Foundation, for archaeological research.

Our student body represents 150 countries and speaks nearly 105 languages, creating a campus with a global perspective.

We enroll nearly 17,000 undergraduate and graduate students in more than 120 majors, minors and concentrations.

Six highly competitive honors programs attract some of the most academically gifted students in the country. Graduates go on to become doctors, engineers, university professors, lawyers and leaders in a variety of other fields.

William E. Macaulay Honors College students are considered to be the most able and highly achieving students in New York.

The Scholars Program, the oldest honors program in the City University of New York and a model for similar programs throughout the United States, offers interdisciplinary seminars and guided research.

The Coordinated B.A.–M.D. Program trains students to become physicians and lays the groundwork for acceptance into the State University of New York Downstate College of Medicine.

The Coordinated Engineering Honors Program offers a course of study equivalent to the first two years at an engineering school and guaranteed transfer to a coordinating school, including Cooper Union and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT).





Radio is a flagship program within the City University of New York and is one of the college's most popular majors. Our state-of-the-art facilities are equipped with post-production facilities, new high-definition cameras and a full HD television studio. Our graduates find employment in nearly every area of television and radio, from on-air talent to cable and industry producers. Students in our media studies program become immersed in scholarly research in broadcast and electronic communications directly related to critical/cultural media studies, management, marketing and programming.

The Barry R. Feirstein Graduate School of Cinema is the college's most ambitious academic undertaking in recent history. Located at Steiner Studios in Brooklyn, the largest studio complex on the East Coast of the United States, it will be the nation's only graduate program seamlessly integrated into a working studio lot. Students will study in the midst of major motion pictures, independent films, music videos and television shows in production. Jonathan Wacks, the school's founding dean, brings extensive experience within the industry and film education, including directing, producing and screenwriting.

Throughout their studies, students will make valuable connections in New York City's entertainment industry. The assembled faculty are professional directors, cinematographers, producers, editors, designers and composers. Their experience and extensive contacts in their field will inform the school's rigorous academic curriculum.

With the first class anticipated to enter in fall 2014, the School of Cinema is set to offer students the most competitive academic and professional training in the entertainment industry.
