## Here are the steps:

- Explore our <u>majors</u> and <u>minors</u>. You will find interesting choices, many focused on arts, business, and sciences.
- 2. <u>Visit us</u>. We offer a range of optional admission events, as well as campus tours.
- 3. Complete your application. <u>Apply online</u>.
  All applications for admission are processed through CUNY. You must register for a portal account in order to complete the application.
- 4. If your native language is not English and you live outside the United States, you must take the <u>Test of English as a Second Language (TOEFL)</u>. Have your scores sent directly to CUNY Admissions. Our code is 2950. A score of 500 is required for the paper-based test; 173 for the computer-based test and 61 for the internet based test. Students can also take the <u>International English Language Testing System (IELTS)</u>. A score of 6 is required on the IELTS.
- 5. For freshman students, send <u>copies</u> of your official high school credentials directly to CUNY's University Application Processing Center.
  - Freshmen students must submit copies of their high school documents with official translations to CUNY if the native language is not English. You do not need to submit evaluations. Students are encouraged to take the <u>SAT</u> or the <u>ACT</u> in order to offered full acceptance to Brooklyn College.
- 6. Remember to send the required documents, along with the \$65 freshman application fee if you are not paying online to:

7. For transfer students, have official transcripts of your post-secondary schooling sent directly to CUNY's University Application Processing Center.

Transfer student are required to have official copies of all of their post-secondary transcripts sent directly from their institutions to the CUNY application center. You do not need to submit evaluations of your post secondary work, only official translations. Note that once you are accepted as a transfer student, you must provide official course descriptions and syllabi of work already completed at the post-secondary level for evaluation by the College.

8. Remember to send the required documents, along with the \$70 transfer application fee if you are not paying online to:

9. Once CUNY has received your completed application for admission, a decision will be sent out within 8-10 weeks. You can check the status of your submitted application by emailing aonline@cuny.edu. Please include your Application Control Number (10-digit number beginning with a "W" that can be found in your Application Summary Package) in the body of the email. You can also call the processing center's automated system at the Office of Admissions Services at (212) 997-2869.

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10. Upon acceptance, you must apply for an I-20 to gain F-1 student visa status. If you are in need of an F-1 visa or F-1 status, you will receive information by mail upon receiving an acceptance package from the college.
