University Dean for Research Travel Funds Program

On occasion it is important for faculty to travel to funding agencies, especially federal agencies, to discuss specific RFPs or RFAs. There are also occasions when faculty members are invited to such funding agencies to discuss their individual proposals. The Office of Academic Affairs has limited funds that can be made available to assist with travel and related costs for such specific occasions. Funds may be reimbursed only for travel to funding agencies or grant proposal workshops. Applicants must apply for reimbursement prior to travel with the form below. These funds are only for reimbursement after travel is completed, and cannot be forwarded.

National Institutes of Health (NIH)

Research Grants (R01)

Deadline for application:
 February 1, June 1, October 1

The R01 provides support for health-related research and development based on the mission of the NIH. R01s can be investigator initiated or can be in response to a program announcement or request for application. The R01 grant is an award made to support a discrete, specified, circumscribed project to be performed by the named investigator(s) in an area representing the investigator's specific interest and competencies, based on the mission of the NIH.

Scope

The NIH is comprised of Institutes and Centers that support specific areas of health-related research and almost all Institutes and Centers at NIH fund R01 grants. Each Institute and Center

maintains a web site with funding opportunities and areas of interest. These should be reviewed carefully and contact with an Institute or Center representative may help focus the research plan based on an understanding of the mission of the Institute or Center.

Application Characteristics

- Applicants for an R01 award are not limited in dollars but need to reflect the actual needs of the proposed project. Modular applications are most prevalent with modules of \$25,000, up to the modular limit of \$250,000. Applications that exceed this level must be submitted as non-modular and provide detailed budget information.
- Applications are generally awarded for 1 - 5 budget periods, each normally 12 months in duration.
- Applications can be renewed by competing for an additional project period.
- Supplements and amendments are allowed.
- Only two revisions of a previously reviewed R01 grant application may be submitted.

The Research Plan (Specific Aims, Background and Significance, Preliminary Studies, and Research Design and Methods) of an application for an R01 follow the instructions provided in PHS 398 Grant Application kit, at <http://grants.nih.gov/grants/forms.htm>.

National Endowment for the Humanities

Implementation Grants for Special Projects

Deadline: February 6, 2006

Special Project grants support a variety of public humanities program formats, including public discussion forums, hands-on learning experiences, discussion series based on reading or film-viewing, multi-faceted conferences, or symposia. Small exhibitions or interpretive publications might serve as common texts for such programs. Living history or historical impersonations might also be appropriate if they are deeply grounded in scholarship.

Applicants for an implementation grant should have already identified their project's key humanities themes, relevant scholarship, and program formats. Most of the planning and consultation with scholars and programming advisors should already have taken place.

Support is available for all typical activities connected with the implementation of a project, including: final consultation with scholars or other advisers; exhibition fabrication; website development; companion publication costs; publicity and promotional expenses; presentation and distribution of public programs and related materials;

and audience evaluation.

Note: Starting in 2006, all institutions applying for an NEH grant must submit their applications via Grants.gov.

Important Proposal Budget Considerations:

- ***Effective immediately the College's F & A rate is 57%.***
- ***Effective 1/1/06 the fringe benefit rate for full-time and part-time A staff will be 35%.***
- ***Effective 7/1/05 the fringe benefit rate for part-time B staff is 10%***
- ***Effective 1/1/05 the fringe benefit rate for released time faculty is 33%***
- ***Effective summer 2006 the fringe benefit for summer salary is 25%.***
