A MINIMUM OF 15 CREDITS (5 COURSES)*

- Employment of interpreters and translators is projected to grow 19 percent from 2018 to 2028, much faster than the average for all occupations.
- Employment growth reflects increasing globalization and a more diverse U.S. population, which is expected to require more interpreters and translators.
- Growing international trade and broadening global ties require more interpreters and translators, especially in emerging markets such as Asia and Africa.
- From medical translation and interpretation, to app and video game localization, the translation industry provides complex services for tourists, expats and businesses large and small. This generates a broad range of new jobs for multilinguals.
